Question: Will there be a Virtual Visit TSWF AIM Form developed?

Answer: Most people use the Core Form and just use sections that are needed. At some MTFs the support staff is now calling the patient ahead of time and doing the screening. One issue is the DVPRS is difficult to do in a virtual visit.

The AIM Form Leads asked: Would it be helpful to add three items (radio buttons) to the top of the Core that could be checked off?

- Virtual Visit
- Patient consented
- Time spent

If MTFs feel a more virtual visit specific form is desired to meet their documentation needs, please submit a request (to include justification and requirements) through the form change request process. If anyone has wording or a Joint Commission requirement, it would be helpful.

Question: Regarding MHS GENESIS, it doesn't seem like much flows from TSWF to GENESIS. Is the TSWF Team involved?

Answer: Yes, we are participating. It is a very slow process. So far, just the Intake portion is there.

The screening provided by CORE, and the pediatric general and age specific forms has been incorporated into MHS GENESIS. All CSSPs, Pain Management, and BHC forms are actively being developed and tested. In addition, workflows for procedures and CPGs are being explored.

Question: How many characters are available for providers to use in the assessment field? Many providers use As-You-Type or other programs with their documentation.

Answer: Character limit within a field on the AIM forms is a constraint. Each field is limited to 2000 characters. If additional space is needed, you can use the field below, “Covid-19 Assessment continued” for more extensive documentation with 2000-character limit.

Question: The link on the CSSP Form for Infectious Disease just goes to a travel screener tool with no place to document. It is misleading. The folks in the field are asking for a CSSP for infectious disease.

Answer: Agree. We will look at taking the Infectious Disease link off the left menu of the CSSP AIM Forms, and just have the link on the Adult Cold CSSP under Exclusions. Will also look at changing the name to DHA Infectious Disease, not DHA CSSP Infectious Disease.

Note: As of May 20, 2020, these changes have been made and the updated DHA CSSP AIM Form is on the Enterprise.
